ABSTRACT

The new issue of 'Andalucía en la Historia, coordinated by the researcher Lola Pons Rodríguez, professor of Spanish Language at the University of Sevilla, studies the evolution of Andalusia as a linguistic territory, from pre-Roman times to the present.

A large group of specialists, from the universities of Cádiz, Granada, Jaén, Málaga, Sevilla and Complutense, review the different languages that have been spoken in the andalusian territory: punic, phoenician, latín, arabic, modern languages, etc. It also inisits in the evolution of the andalusian spanish varietys as well as in the unique mixture betwenn spanish and english: llanito, used in the Gibraltar Area.
